





PALLIATIVE CARE & END OF LIFE SERVICES SERVICES PALLIATIFS ET DE FIN DE VIE

RESIDENTIAL HOSPICE SERVICES

In addition to offering end of life care, our team can now offer shorter stay beds for caregiver relief, caregiver education as well as pain and symptom management for residents with a prognosis of 12 months or less.



Sudbury Senior Games

Pachi the Porcupine will be the head cheerleader when we applaud an expected 1,200 athletes participating in the Ontario 55+ Summer Games in our city from Aug. 5 to 7.

The games provide an opportunity for senior athletes to engage in friendly competitive sports and games, showcasing their skills and dedication to sports.

The Sudbury 2025 promises to be bigger and better, bringing together participants from across Ontario to compete in activities such as pickleball, tennis, cycling, golf, bocce and darts.

Activities will take place at venues throughout the city including the Timberwolf Golf Club, Cambrian Athletics Centre, the Terry Fox Sports Complex, Naughton

Community Centre and Howard Armstrong Recreation Centre. Five-pin bowling will take place in Sturgeon Falls.

Sudbury has experience hosting signature events such as the Ontario Summer Games in 2010. Barb Nott is chair of the games organizing committee,

More than 200 volunteers will be recruited to make sure everything goes as planned. People who are interested in volunteering can register at the Sudbury 2025 website: 55summergames. greatersudbury.ca or by phoning the city's help line 311.

Volunteers must be at least 14 years old, attend a mandatory in-person orientation session in July; be available Aug. 5, 6 and 7; and submit a police record check.

"We are thrilled to host the 2025 Ontario 55+ Games. This is an exciting opportunity not only to showcase our vibrant community, but also to draw visitors from across the province," said Paul Lefebvre, mayor of Greater Sudbury, in a media statement.

"Hosting these games allows us to continue growing our capacity for large-scale sports tourism events, generating economic benefits and cultivating community collaboration. We look forward to welcoming the athletes and their families to Greater Sudbury in August. Together, we will create unforgettable experiences that

celebrate the spirit of active living."

In addition to the 1,200 participants, their families and friends are expected to attend and to enjoy the city's tourist attractions to bring

in approximately \$1.5-million in economic impact.

The opening ceremonies will take place Tuesday, Aug. 5 followed by two days of sporting events.

The costs will be financed by several sources including the Ontario Ministry of Sport Hosting Grant and the Greater Sudbury Development Corporation's Tourism Development Fund. Registration fees and

sponsorships are expected to bring in about \$100,000 from across Ontario.

The 2025 Ontario 55+ Summer Games is expected to generate more than \$1.5 million in local economic benefits.

Pachi the Porcupine is the official mascot of the Ontario Games. He first made an appearance in 2015 as the mascot at the Pan Am and Parapan Am Games in Toronto.

FEET IN THE HEAT



We really shouldn't complain about the heat after the long cold winter we had, but this summer sure has been a hot one. Summer can be a great time with golfing, walking, sightseeing, or shopping. Unfortunately, the high temperatures and humidity can create problems which can turn a great day into a miserable one.

When humidity is high, it can cause swelling of the feet. This makes our shoes that fit in the morning too tight by the afternoon. Blisters can develop along the back of the heel, the sides of the foot, and on top of the toes. When going shopping or sightseeing for the day, always wear your most comfortable shoe that can be adjusted to accommodate any swelling. Wearing socks or nylons rather than bare feet can also help to prevent blisters. You many want to bring along an extra pair of sandals just in case and always make sure to have band-aids on hand.

Swelling can also cause the toes to rub together and a soft corn can develop. Soft corns occur between the toes and are very painful. Moisture between the toes can make these corns even worse. Staying away from narrow toed shoes will help to avoid this problem. The pointier the shoe, the more the toes will rub. If you already have a soft corn, you can get some relief by keeping the toes apart using cotton wool or a foam toe wedge. A daily swab using rubbing alcohol between the toes to reduce the moisture also helps. Most soft corns need to be reduced by a foot specialist for any real relief.

Athletes foot is also very common during the summer. Athletes foot is a fungal infection of the skin that can cause itchiness, peeling skin, small blisters, and redness. An odour is usually present as well. There are over the counter and prescription medication available for this problem. If you are prone to athletes foot, you may want to take a look at your footwear. Fungus thrives in a dark, moist, warm environment. Discouraging this type of environment can help eliminate the fungus. Try to wear open, airy shoes, or sandals. Wash your feet twice a day making sure to dry well in between the toes. Stay away from enclosed shoes, especially vinyl ones.

If your feet are sore it can ruin your whole day. Try to prevent blisters or corns from occurring and be prepared in case they

do. This will ensure a long, enjoyable summer on your feet.

GREY VS BROWN -TITIANS COLLIDE!

One of the most asked questions is 'what is on trend, grey or brown?' Although over the last 5 years grey has been dominating the selections in the store, brown is making a comeback in the blonder tones, and to be honest, brown tones are the classic choice and continue to be our tried and true.

I think the most important thing to remember when decorating is what you lean toward. I would say 9 times out of ten, our clients' first choice usually ends up being their final decision, so it

doesn't matter if its grey or brown, you will always go to what you love.

If I were designing for your space and you asked me what you should pick, I would steer you in the direction of the emotion or feeling you are trying to evoke. A cooler palette or a warm palette can lend to different feelings, and both can be beautiful in the end when done right. I would also encourage you to elevate your space by combining colour combinations and layering in both grey tones and brown tones.

Grey and browns are colours from nature. They exist happily together along with blacks, greens, and blues. It is so interesting to bring the two tones together in thoughtful decisions to make people say, "I love what you have done here," but they can't quite put their finger on it. Stay away from grey on grey on grey, or brown on brown on brown, and lean into finding the complementary warmth that balances the coolness in the room or vice versa. I promise you it is worth it.

Tip of the summer - be careful with grey paints; some can look purple or blue depending on the natural light in your space. Take the time to paint a colour patch to make sure

that tone pulls out the selection in your floors. Ask for help, be open to process, and pull from nature with all cool and warm tones.

The impact of getting the news of having a life limiting illness can cause a person and their loved ones to go through waves of varying thoughts and feelings. VHS volunteers provide a space filled with warmth and care to individuals and their caregivers during the end-of-life journey.


